Meetings with Ambassadors to the Holy See

throughout the month of July. The meetings saw commitments from some of the Ambassadors to sustain WUCWO at the international fora with regards to some of the conclusions of the Conference as well as opened avenues for possible future projects.

The Vice President General, Maribeth Stewart, spoke at the Convention of the Catholic Women's Association of Cameroon in the USA that was held in Atlanta, GA from 14-16 August 2015 and found a wonderful joy-filled group of ladies. WUCWO Argentina

Since 2013, WUCWO Argentinean organisations have been taking part in a round table on **Human Trafficking** organised by the Justice and Peace Commission of the Bishop's Conference of Argentina. On July 30th, a theatre piece called *Mika* was shown at Buenos Aires, inspired from the story of Marita Veron who is a victim of human trafficking. The large audience numbers and the media helped to raise awareness of this grave violation of human rights and encouraged people to act against it.

Manos Unidas



Manos Unidas from Spain has shared with us that in July, they established an emergency fund of 30,232euros to help 7000 people directly affected by the floods that hit Bangladesh, one of the poorest countries in the world. The houses, made of bamboo, have completely disappeared; the rice, vegetables, and banana crops were flooded by mud and water. The roads were rendered useless and thus providing food and medical care very difficult. The fund will be used to rebuild houses, build wells for drinking water, paths and bridges for access.



Femina Europa

Femina Europa, from France, with three other NGOs has worked on the declaration entitled 'Women of the World' which was presented to the European Parliament in Brussels and to the CSW in New York. The declaration was signed by 148 NGOs from 5 continents, including WUCWO as an international organisation.
