## **AUDIENCE WITH THE PREFECT OF THE NEW DICASTERY**



Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Prefect of the new **Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life**, received with high esteem the President General, the Ecclesiastical Assistant and the Secretary General of WUCWO, on January 20, 2017. He encouraged to keep on the connection with the Catholic women from the Middle East and welcomed the notification of WUCWO's change of domicile, which was moved from France (Paris) to Italy (Rome) by unanimous vote of the Board at its meeting in October 2016. It recommended to work with the youth, to act against human trafficking, particularly in Africa and the Philippines, and demanded a greater dissemination of the activities being carried out by our organisation.

## PRESENTATION OF THE WOMEN'S CONSULTATION GROUP



The Women's Consultation Group, **body of the Pontifical Council for Culture**, was presented in the Press Room of the Holy See on March 7 by Cardinal Gianfranco Ravasi, who wants all the activities of his dicastery to have a women's point of view. Since 2015, 35 women, economists, scientists, entrepreneurs, intellectuals, athletes, journalists, actresses and theologians, even non-Christians, have been part of this commission; among these women, there is the President of WUCWO, who can bring the experience of some 10 million committed Catholic women in their respective countries.
